Mary Fox Workshop - at Kwantlen

Saturday, Jan 14th, from 10am-4pm

Mary is a renowned ceramic artist living in Ladysmith. Whether creating decorative vessels, sculptures or functional pottery, Mary says her work focuses on "expressing the beauty and strength of pure form".

This workshop offers a unique "hands on" component where Mary will spend time in the afternoon working with each participant. We have 12 wheels and tables for handbuilding. This session will be limited to 12 people to give time to each person in problem solving or working out new techniques. Handles may be pulled and refined and an optional non-threatening critique of your work will be offered - bring a few pieces you like and a few that you're not happy with. We can all learn from this.

The morning session is open to everyone and will have different offerings from the evening presentation of the Fri. meeting. Mary will discuss style and design and will possibly present a slide show of her work, and a video of her throwing a large vessel in 2 stages (that's what I'm excited to see!)

Cost: Morning session \$15. All day - \$40. Costs subject to full enrollment. Bring your own clay that you want to work with, or buy from David H435 for \$10/bag. Potluck lunch.
