

Guest Presenter - Eliza Au

.Eliza Au will speak about her journey through education, residencies and a teaching practice and how they have changed or influenced her ceramic practice. Through the method of slipcasting she explores the complexities of pattern in two-dimensional and three-dimensional space.



Eliza Au received her BFA from the Nova Scotia College of Art and Design (2005) and her MFA from the New York State College of Ceramics at Alfred University (2009). Au's work is ceramic based and centers around the process of slipcasting. She is interested in



how sacred space is transformed by the use of pattern and geome-

try in Gothic and Islamic architecture. She is interested in how systems work and how they relate to symmetry, repetition and scale. In recent work, she is expanding into other materials, including paper, metal, glass and wax.

She has previously completed residencies
The Museum of Contemporary Craft
Glass (Corning, NY). Recent exhibitions
at Scripps College and *The RBC Emerging*ner Museum in Toronto, ON.
