Herman Venema is a potter and teacher who has had a studio in Abbotsford since 1971.

His first introductions to clay were in 1962 at the University of Michigan, and in1963-1965 at UBC when Stan Clark was teaching pottery there.

After teaching high school Art and English for three years, he returned to graduate school at the University of Puget Sound, to study with Carlton Ball.

Carlton Ball's fondness for big pots and texture rubbed off on him, but the forms and decoration of Japanese potters like Shoji Hamada were his main inspiration.

Most of his work is functional, but he makes fountains and critters like frogs and salamanders as well.

POTS AND CRITTERS FOR CAMPBELL VALLEY FAIR: As part of our membership, we are also obliged to make 20 little pots/ 10 big ones or 20 critters that have been coded and bisque fired - and hopefully waxed on the bottoms and labeled with masking tape as a claim check for pick-up by the owner post rakuing. During the summer, numerous Critter-making events took place, and I thank Jenny, Heather, Audrey, the Chilliwack girls and the Semiahmoo girls for all doing their part in hosting these events. If individuals still need a place to bisque theirs, I'd be happy to if you bring them by in the 1st week of Sept. Waiting for the meeting night is too late, as our Campbell Valley Fair is 2 days later. However pots that are ready and need to get to the Fair for Sat. can be brought to the meeting and we will see that they get there. I realize that some people just aren't able to make things and we welcome them as members just the same. Hopefully they find some other way to contribute to the guild through the year in that case. The funds we raise pay for our guest artists at each meeting throughout the year and that is one of the things that make our guild special.

**CAMPBELL VALLEY FAIR** - **RAKU FUNDRAISER** - **Work shifts for the various booths SEPT 15 and 16**: We need everyone's participation for this 2day Raku Fundraising event. Very few people have signed up yet as you can see from the Schedule, so please let me know ASAP which shift and job you'd like, so that I don't have to phone everyone. Your work must be taken to the Fair for 5pm Fri. evening the 14th, and set up at that time ready for opening Sat. Please make arrangements with someone to take it for you if you can't be there. We don't do inventory sheets - unless you want one for yourself, but clearly mark each piece with a peelable sticker with the last 3 or 4 letters of your last name, and the price. It's a good idea to put an extra masking tape label on the bottom in case the one on the side of the pot peels off.


